MEDICINES CONTROL COUNCIL WISHES TO APPOINT QUALITY AND BIOEQUIVALENCE EVALUATORS OF APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION OF MEDICINES

The Medicines Control Council (MCC) is responsible for regulating all medicines and medical devices in South Africa by ensuring that they meet standards of safety, efficacy and quality. The MCC operates in terms of the Medicines and Related Substances Act, 1965 (Act 101 of 1965), the Regulations issued in terms of that Act, and associated guidelines. In considering the availability of any medicine for human or animal use, the MCC assesses the product in terms of safety, efficacy and quality.

The MCC is specifically requesting submission of *curriculum vitae* by persons with post-graduate pharmacy degree/s or equivalent, and experienced in the disciplines of **pharmaceutical chemistry/organic chemistry, pharmaceuticals and pharmaceutical development**, for potential appointment as technical evaluators of the quality and bioequivalence aspects of medicine registration applications. Potential applicants should not be associated with, or employed by the pharmaceutical industry and will therefore be required to provide full disclosure of interests in relation to the private Industry, with specific reference to the pharmaceutical industry and related industries, e.g. clinical research organisations.
